

Overview

Every summer, **Trinity Kids** operates two separate week-long residence (overnight) camps as part of the [Royal Family KIDS](#) program. These camps are offered for FREE to children (6-12) living in the foster care system in North Texas communities.

Although there are numerous volunteer positions where you can serve at our camps, our primary need is for volunteers to work directly with the children as a Camp Guide. As a volunteer who works with children in our organization, you will be required to complete a volunteer application, pass a background check, and be interviewed by our executive directors and other staff members.

Positions

- **Camp Guide** – work directly with two children (of the same gender) for the entire week
- **Camp Staff** – participate as part of the team that serves the children, Camp Guides, and ensures the smooth operation of the entire camp week
- **Nurse** – must be a registered nurse who will serve as the primary contact for all medical issues throughout the week and manage the dispensing of all medications to campers and staff
- **Coach** – helps setup, operate, and clean-up for all sports-related activities at camp
- **A/V Technician** – provides support for all audio/visual needs throughout the week including sound, microphones, music, projectors, and presentations
- **Photographer** – must offer photography skills better than an amateur photographer and assume responsibility for all still- and live-action photography including final creation of the “Week at Camp” presentation
- **Arts & Crafts** – provide support for all arts and crafts activities throughout the week including the preparation, setup, instruction, and cleanup of all arts and crafts activities and stations
- **Woodworkers/Carpenters** – provide support for designing and building all props for the stage as well as any additional requirements for arts and crafts or other activities as may be planned for camp
- **Pre-Camp Pack** – help load all necessary supplies, equipment, props, stage, and any other items needed at camp from the storage units to the trucks taking items to the camp. Drive to camp to unload and help with setup of some items before camp begins.
- **Post-Camp Unpack** – drive to camp to help load all items taken to camp onto the trucks taking items back to the storage units. Help with the unloading of the trucks and carefully storing all items back into the storage units.
- **Post-Camp Dinner Hosts** – provide support for the post-camp dinner for all children, their guardians, Camp Guides, and Camp Staff, upon their return from a week at camp. This includes setup of dinner facility, preparation of some food/drink items, serving, and clean-up.
